JWTS - the new opportunity for the ambitious tennis kids and juniors around the world!



The international tournaments for juniors and children have been part of the calendar of all organizing associations for years, but for many talented young people they only take a lot of effort and effort in relation to the measurable result.

The resulting experiences of the young competitors, their coaches, parents and companions, but also the thoughts of people with decades of experience in tennis, whether tournament organizers, marketers, coaches or supervisors, ultimately eventuated in a small group of these veterans developing a novel approach. The focus of the endeavor is to promote young talents in tennis by the possibility to play many international tournaments to ease the leap into professional business.

The outcome: JWTS - Junior World Tennis Series, the first worldwide high-level junior tournament series in the age groups U12-14-16 with world ranking. U9-10 will be promo events. With this series, the first world ranking for the youngest in this sport is created. First of all, the best players are determined regionally to qualify for the world finals. This means that players from every region will play in the world finals! Well-known tennis ambassadors at the respective events, exclusive prizes, and other additional services should motivate people to take part in the tournament series. The series will start in particular regions and will later be carried out throughout all continents.

Iroda Tulyaganova Vice-President Asia



Iroda have started to play tennis at age 9. Iroda won 6 tournaments in the ITF Junior Tour. The biggest win was 1999 when she won Wimbledon juniors in singles and US-Open juniors in doubles. Her highest ranking was number 4 in the world.

Iroda had career-high WTA rankings of 16 in singles and 28 in doubles. She won three singles titles and four doubles titles on the WTA Tour. In 2003 she stopped and she returned to the main tour in 2006 after a long injury absence, and in Kolkata in September 2006, she reached the semifinals as a qualifier. The following week, she reached the final of her home event in Tashkent. She also won the women's singles gold medal in the 2002 Asian Games in Busan by defeating Tamarine Tanasugarn of Thailand, and the mixed-doubles bronze medal.

Now Iroda is working for the Uzbekistan Tennis Federation.

She also have her own tennis school in Tashkent.
